# Clean-Energy Shares Hardly Move as Trump Pulls Out of Paris

Donald Trump has spoken: the U.S. will exit the landmark 2015 Paris climate accord. And clean-energy investors yawned.

The WilderHill New Energy Global Innovation Index of companies in renewable and low-carbon energy barely budged, gaining less than 0.1 percent on Friday. Solar stocks rose slightly, with the xxx Solar adding as much as 0.8 percent. The research group's wind index, the xxx Wind , increased by about the same.

The muted response is a sign that investors expect demand for clean energy will continue to grow, in the U.S. and around the world.

"I don't think there is going to be an unwillingness for renewables because they leave the Paris accord," said Vestas xxx by phone. "We have a huge backlog in the U.S., we're going to build a lot there."
